



HOUSE RULES 2011

- No outside association or organization as such shall be permitted to use the Club. However a member may schedule and make arrangements for a business meeting or group meeting for an association or organization with which the member is associated, subject to the provisions of Article V of these Bylaws.
- A Club member may reserve or sponsor an event for the Ballroom or any other private room on the main floor for a private function, subject to the following conditions:
 - Reservations must be made through the General Manager.
 - The prescribed fee may be required by the member to the Club for said use.
 - Non-members may attend as member's guests.
 - The size of the function will be limited to the number of people that the Club can accommodate.
- Non-members, except bona fide guests of members, are not permitted to use any facilities of the Club House.
- Unescorted guests (extended family, friends, business, etc.) may only use the Club facilities on a limited basis and only with prior notification by the member to the General Manager, Golf Pro or Tennis Pro. Charges will be posted to the member's account. Members should attempt to accompany their guests if at all possible.
- Only members and guests of members are entitled to attend Club functions unless the announcement of the function states otherwise. Any woman or man, who would otherwise be excluded, may attend Club functions, as a guest if she or he is a date of a member.
- Members are responsible for the conduct of their guests and for damage committed by themselves or their guests.
- The Club House will normally close following dinner or at the latest 12:00 Midnight. For private functions, extended hours may be arranged at an additional cost.
- The 19th Hole and Card Room will close at the discretion of the General Manager, depending on usage of areas.
- On Mondays, all facilities of the Club House will be closed except the Snack Bar, Fitness Center, Business Office and Locker Rooms. For special functions, the Club will be open seven days a week. Board approval may be required.
- The Club shall not be responsible for loss of personal property brought to the Club by members, guests, or visitors.

For the safety of its members and guests and in accordance with state laws, it is policy of the Henderson Country Club to refuse to serve alcoholic beverages to minors and/or intoxicated individuals. The Club expects members and their guests to respect the judgment of Club employees who refuse to serve an alcoholic beverage to a minor or individuals who are suspected to be intoxicated. Members who abuse or refuse to cooperate with Club employees attempting to enforce this policy will be subject to disciplinary action by the Board of Directors.

- Members may not bring onto the premises any food or beverages regularly supplied by the Club.
- Animals are not allowed in the main Club House except for guide animals.
- Parking shall be confined to areas provided for that purpose.
- The Club will not permit smoking in enclosed areas.
- Any gift certificate will expire within one year from issue date.
- The use of cellular telephones is prohibited in all dining areas of the Club. Incoming ringing calls should not be audible. Outgoing calls are not allowed in the dining areas. In the event you receive a call, please answer the phone and exit the dining area immediately.

MEN'S AND LADIES' LOCKER ROOMS AND LOUNGE

- For adult members and their guests only, the presence of persons under 18 years of age is prohibited.
- Members are required to keep their clothes lockers locked at all times, except when at the locker.
- The Club will not be responsible for any articles placed in lockers.
- All clothing must be kept in a locker. In no event shall clothing or other personal effects be left on the top of lockers.
- Bath towels must not be removed from the locker room and placed in laundry bag.

FOOD DEPARTMENT

- Hours of service in the food department will be published monthly in the Club bulletin.

DRESS CODE

A dress code is specified and enforced for the sole purpose of providing a comfortable, enjoyable and appropriate environment for member usage of the various areas of the Club. The following guidelines should accomplish that objective:

- Club House Main Level Evening attire - Business casual/Country Club casual. **Dress shorts (Bermuda style) and collared shirts shall be allowed Memorial Day thru Labor Day.** Men should remove all hats when entering the main level. No style of denim/jeans allowed. Coats/ties optional unless other attire called for by specific occasion. **Members and their guests that are improperly dressed may be asked to dine in another open area.**
- 19th Hole- Snack Bar- Patio Business casual or casual. Reasonable children's clothing, proper jeans, warm-up suits, proper shorts. Bathing suits must be covered when inside any area of the clubhouse, short shorts etc. Shoes are required.
- Golf Course - Proper attire is required at all times on the golf course and the practice facilities. All golfing attire will be in good taste and in good order. Male golfers (including junior golfers) must always wear shirts with collars or mock necks. Junior golfers (12 years or under) may wear shirts without collars. Swimming or jogging attire may not be worn while playing or practicing golf. Golf shorts should be Bermuda style, and of acceptable overall length. Other shorts, including swimming, jogging, hiking, tennis, coaching, etc., are not considered appropriate for wear on the golf course or the practice facilities. Blue jeans, "cut-offs", painter pants, tee shirts, sleeveless shirts (other than appropriate women's sleeveless blouses), tank tops, high-heeled shoes and rippled sole shoes are strictly prohibited. Traditional metal golf spikes are not permitted; soft spikes are required. Shoes other than golf shoes must be approved by the Golf Professional. Members are responsible for the attire of their guests. Golfers should change into golfing attire in the locker rooms or dressing areas provided for that purpose. Changing clothes in other areas of the Club (e.g., parking lot) is prohibited.
- Tennis Courts - Regulation tennis attire to include smooth bottom tennis shoes. No bathing suits allowed in the tennis area.
- Fitness Center - Proper exercise attire. Cover-ups should be worn when moving to and from Club areas.
- Members and their guests are requested to change clothing in the Locker Rooms.
- Swimming Pool – Everyone must wear a regulation swimsuit. No "cut offs" or leather belts will be allowed in the pool. Wading Pool – Disposable diapers are not allowed in the pool at any time. Pool approved infant swim safety pants are allowed and must be supplied by family.
